2013 m. konkursas „Jaunas žmogus XXI amžiuje“ vėl buvo įspūdingas dalyvių skaičiumi ir plačia geografija. Konkursui savo darbus atsiuntė daugiau kaip 100 autorių ne tik iš Lietuvai kaimyninių, bet ir iš tolimų šalių (JAV, Alžyro, Nyderlandų ir kt.). Ne mažiau įvairi buvo ir atsiųstų fotografijų stilistika, bei jaunuosius kūrėjus sudominusios temos. Jaunų fotografų kūrybos įvairovę atspindi ir apdovanojimus pelniusią konkurso dalyvių darbai. Tačiau šioje įvairovėje taip pat išryškėja tie kūrybinės fotografijos aspektai, kurie ją daro vertingą, nepriklausomai nuo individualių autorių stilistinių ar tematinų pasirinkimų.

Žengti pirmą žingsnį link „stiprios“ fotografijos tenka dar prieš paimant į rankas fotoaparatu. Prieš pradédamas fotografuoti, autorius turėtų surasti jų dominančią temą ir aiškią žinotį, ką apie ją norėtų papasakoti žiūrovui. Be to, fotografinis pasakojimas bus įdomesnis ir geriau atskleis fotografo autorinį braizą, jei neapsiribos keliais išraiškingai kadrais, bet bus papasakotas vienas kitą papildančių atvaizdų serijoje. Kaip tik tokiu būdu konkurso laureatai fotografijomis perteikė juos sudominusias istorijas: lietuvė Dovilė Barakauskaitė – apie atlaidus, Elizaveta Dmitrijeva iš Rusijos – apie pasiruošimą Sočio olimpinėms žaidynėm ir senelių gyvenimą, Karolina Kraska iš Lenkijos – apie koncertus ir patriotinius mitingus, o rusės Lianos Gukasyan serijos jungiamuoju motyvu tapo miegantys žmonės.

Žinoma, reportažiniu metodu sukurtų atvaizdų seką nėra vienintelis būdas fotografijoje įdomiai išplėtoti vieną ar kitą temą ir įtaigiai išreikšti savo požiūrį. Dalis konkurso žiuri įvertinimą pelniusią autorų pasirinko visai kitokią kūrybinę taktiką. Pavyzdžiui, lenkaitė Sylvia Bednarz sugretino senas ir šiuolaikines fotografijas, sukurdama netikėtas, vaizdų asociacijoje gimstančias prasmes, jos vyresnė tautietė Evelina Rutkovska taip pat savo kūrybai panaudojo (šeimos) archyvo fotografijas, pridėdama labai asmeniškus komentarus. Kiti (Oksana Zorina ir Artiomas Sokolovas iš Rusijos, lietuvis Dainius Ščiuka) rinkosi šiuolaikinėje fotografijoje populiarą surežis uotos, keistu dirbtinumu dvelkiančią fotografijų estetiką. Tačiau ir šių autorių fotografijų serijose kiekviena nuotrauka papildo bendrą, visą seriją siejančią temą.

Kartais įdomaus pasakojimo ar tiesiog aktualaus ir kritiško paties autorius požiūrio į šiandieninį gyvenimą

pakanka, kad fotografijų serija būtų pastebėta ir įvertinta. Tai patvirtina Tinos Remiz gyvenančios Jungtinėje karalystėje ir Latvijoje jautrus pasakojimas „Vieta, kur manęs néra“, lietuvio Vytenio Jurevičiaus fotografijos iš koncertų, o ypač – bendras baltarusių Viktorijos Dvorianskos ir Elenos Aleksandrovič darbas „Aš žvaigždė“.

Tačiau net ir tokioje temų bei stilistikų įvairovėje vis dėlto galima pasigesti vieno labai svarbaus geros fotografijos bruožo. Daugelis jaunuų autorų nėra linkę objektyvo atgręžti į tai, kas yra arčiausiai jų ir tiesiogine, ir perkeltinge prasme. Dauguma konkurso dalyvių savo kūryboje „neatvirauja“, taip pat didžioji dalis fotografų nesigilina į galbūt asmeniškai jiems gerai pažįstamas jaunimo gyvenimo puses. Šiuo požiūriu, viena iš nedaugelio išimčių yra konkurso Gran Prix laimėtojas Sergejus Poterajevas iš Rusijos ir jo serija „Alkana širdis“. Jo fotografijos pasakoja apie kassavaitinį jaunimo lankymąsi naktiniuose klubuose, kuris, pasak autoriaus, daugeliui jaunų žmonių jau virto savotišku karnavalinišku ritualu.

S. Poterajevas kartu su keletu kitų autorii (E. Rutkovska, T. Remiz) tarsi rodo vieną iš galimų krypcijų, kur jaunimo kuriama fotografija galėtų būti nepralenkiama. Net ir patyre meistrai ne visada ras būdą jaunystę su visu jos grožiu ir sunkumais pamatyti iš taip arti, kaip tai gali padaryti jaunieji autoriai. Pasaulio fotografijos istorija rodo, kad šio artilimo žvilgsnio į jaunus žmones ir autentiškų išgyvenimų perteikimo užteko, jog būtų sukurti dabar chrestomatiniais tapę fotografijos kūriniai. Tad džiaugdamiesi ne tik apdovanotais, bet ir visais kitais konkursui atsiųstais darbais, linkime kūryboje nekartoti jauno žmogaus ir jo gyvenimo stereotipų, kuriuos sukūrė kiti, bet atviru žvilgsniu pažvelgti į savo asmeninę patirtį ir paklausti savęs, kas joje svarbiausia, kuo ji gali būti artima ir aktuali kitiems (nebūtinai vien tik jauniems) žmonėms?

The contest 'Young man in the XXI century' held in 2013 was again impressive in a number of participants and a wide geography. More than 100 contestants, not only from neighboring countries but from far countries such as USA, Algerian Netherlands and others, presented their works. The stylistic diversity of photographs was not less important and the topics young photographers were interested in as well. The works of awarded contestants reflect the variety of created works by young photographers. However, this variety also shows up the creative aspects of photography what makes it valuable regardless of the individual author's stylistic and thematic choice.

The first step towards a 'strong' photography takes place before taking a camera in your hands. Prior to shooting the author should look for the topic he or she is interested in and know clearly what he would like to tell a viewer about. Moreover, photo story will be more interesting and better reveal the portrait photographer's style, if you are not limited by several expressive shots, but this will be narrated in series of supplementary images. Just this way the contest winners by their photographs conveyed the stories they were interested in: the Lithuanian Dovile Barakauskaite – about fiests, a Russian Elizaveta Dmitrieva - about preparation for Sochi Olympic Games and the life of elderly people, Karolina Kraska from Poland – about concerts and patriotic mass rallies. Series of sleeping people became as connecting motives in the works of Liana Gukasian from Russia.

Of course, a photograph journalism approach to create a sequence of images is not the only way in photography which enables to develop in an interesting way one or another subject and express forcefully their views. Some of the jury chose the award winning author who took different creative tactics. For example, a Polish Sylwia Bednarz juxtaposed old photograpbs to contemporary ones by creating unexpected meanings born in the assotiation of images; her elder compatriot Ewelina Rutkowska also used in her creative work familiar archival photographs, accompanied by very personal comments. Others (Oxana Zorina and Artyom Sokolov from Russia, a Lithuanian Dainius Schiuka) chose in contemporary photography popularly staged with the smell of strange artificiality of photograpf reflecting aesthetics. However, in the series of photographs by these authors each

photo adds to the overall picture a full line linking theme.

Sometimes it is enough of an interesting story or just an actual and critical view of the same author on the today's life in order the series of photographs could be noticed and appreciated. This is estimated by Tina Remez', who lives in the United Kingdom and Latvia, sensitive story titled "The place where I am not", photos from a concert taken by Vytenis Jurevicius from Lithuania and especially a joint work 'I am a star' by Victoria Dvorianska and Elena Aleksandrovich from Bielorussia.

However, one very important trait of a good photography may be missing even in a such diversity of themes and style. A lot of young authors are tend not to face the lens on what is closest to them both in a direct and figurative sense. Most of the contest participants are not frank in their creation as well as most of the photographers probably do not get deep into the heart of the familiar to them youth's sides of life. From this standpoint, one exception is the contest's Gran Prix winner Sergej Poteryev from Russia and his series 'A hungry heart'. His photographs tell us a story of the youth attending night clubs weekly, what according to the author, turned into a kind of carnival ritual.

S. Poteryev along with several other authors (E. Rutkowska, T. Remiz) appear to indicate one of the possible directions where the youth's developed photography can be unsurpassable. Even experienced masters not always can find a way to see closely the youth with all their beauty and difficulties so close as the young authors managed to do it. The history of the world photography shows that this close look at young people an imparted authentic experience was enough to create works of photography which have become chrestomatic textbooks. Thus re-joying not only at the rewarded but for all the entrie, we would like to wish you not to repeat a young man and the stereotypes of his life in your future creation, but look at your own experience and ask yourself what is the most important, in what way can be close and become relevant to others (not obligatory to young ones).

Youth who loves pleasure and lives with a hunger for unrealizable unending happiness, which could substitute them one-night stand and illusion of general love.





