2015 m. konkursas „Jaunas žmogus XXI a.“ vyko jau septynį kartą. Septyni metai fotografijos konkursui – reikšmingas laikotarpis, ypač, jei tas konkursas skirtas jauniesiems autoriams. Per septynis metus ne tik fotografijoje, bet ir kituose šiuolaikinio meno srityse jvyksta ženklūs pokyčiai, išryškėja naujos, aktualios kūrybos tendencijos, o tas tendencijas įtvirtinę debiutantai tampa pripažintais menininkais. Panašių atradimų norisi tikėtis ir iš šio konkurso, nes kaip tik jaunujių darbams paprastai būdinga dinamiška kaita, eksperimentai, meno tradicijų ir institucijų ne-suvaržyta kūrybinė laisvė.

Žinoma, nei gyvenimas visuomenės paribiuose, nei ižymybų fotografiavimas nėra būtina sąlyga kūrybinei sėkmėi. Daug svarbiau – betariškas fiksuojamo gyvenimo pažinimas, tikri išgyvenimai ir nesumeluotas jų perteikimas kūryboje. Todėl ir svarbiausias konkursui atsiųstų darbų vertinimo kriterijus jau ne vienerius metus išlieka tas pats – aktualų jaunimo problemų atspindėjimas. Gebėjimas pajusti tai, kas svarbu jauniausiai kartai, ir nuoširdžiai tai perteikti fotografijoje gali būti raktas į sėkmę ne tik šiame konkurse, bet ir tolesnėje kūrybinėje karjeroje. Tiesą sakant, visa tai reikšminga ne tik jaunujių kūrybos kontekste. 2009 m. žinomas Lietuvos fotografas Rimantas Vikšraitis nustebino tarptautinę fotografijos žinovų auditoriją ir laimėjo metų atradimo prizą fotografijos festivalyje Arlyje (Prancūzija), Jame pristatęs nuoširdžias, nepretenzingas, tačiau skaudžias socialines problemas atskleidžiančias Lietuvos kaimo gyventojų fotografijas.

Vis dėlto, toks jautumas dabarties (jaunimo) gyvenimui ir atvirumas kūrybiniams eksperimentams būdingas tik nedaugeliui konkurso dalyvių. Kaip bebūtų keista, ne vienas jaunasis autorius imasi iš anksto nuspėjamų temų arba, regis, tiesiog reprodukuoja žiniasklaidos ir viešosios nuomonės perduodamas žinutes. Rūkymas, alkoholis, prilausomybė nuo šiuolaikinių technologijų – visos šios problemos, be abejo, gyvos dabarties visuomenėje. Bet kiek šios „statistikinės“ blogybės aktualios konkrečiam fotografijų autorui? Galbūt minėtų problemų inscenizacijas prieš kamerą kuriantys fotografai ir jų draugai tikrame gyvenime sprendžia savo asmeniškas, individualias problemas? Net jei jos atrodo nereikšmingos ir nevertos viešumos, gal būtų atpažintos bendraamžių ir įsimintų fotografijos profesionalams?

Neatsitiktinai jaunesniųjų autorų grupėje pirmoji vieta atiteko Gabrielei Vektinaitei, kuri savo darbuose pasakoja apie žmonių asmeninius išgyvenimus ir tarpusavio ryšius. Kitų prizinių vietų laimėtojai – lenkė Anna Soczawa ir Katarzyna Mie-

lech iš Lietuvos – taip pat renkasi „mažus“ ir asmeniškus pasaikojimus, kurie sujungia praeitį ir dabartį, skirtingas kartas ir jų gyvenimo aplinkybes. Ukrainiečiai Vladimir Miščenko ir Marija Basova betariškai išgyvena ir fiksuoja tai, ką daugelis mūsų mato tik žiniasklaidoje – jų šalyje vykstančius politinius neramumus ir karinio konflikto atgarsius. Tuo tarpu lietuvių Ignės Grikevičiūtės darbuose asmeniškai išgyvenama tikrovė bei socialinė aplinka svarbu tiek pat, kiek ir nesuvaržyti kūrybiniai eksperimentai.

Tuo tarpu vyresniųjų fotografų grupėje išryškėja ir techninės bei estetinės darbų kokybės svarba. Nors kiekvienu atveju, priklausomai nuo pasirinkto žanro ir temos, tos kokybės kriterijai yra vis kiti, tačiau konkurso žiuri pastebėti autorai savo darbų stilistiką pasirenka pagrįstai ir nuosekliai jos laikosi. Kūrybos stilistiniu vientisu mu ir kokybiškumu tarp visų konkurso dalyvių aiškiai išsiskyrė Grand Prix laimėtojas Mikhail Shestakov iš Rusijos. Nors autorius pasirenka skirtinges žanrus – akto, portreto – tačiau tai nėra vien tušti kūrybiniai bandymai. Kiekvienu atveju fotografo darbus vienija aiškūs estetiniai sprendimai, įtaigiai perteikiantys fotografijų mintį ar emocinį krūvį. Tą patį galima pasakyti ir apie kitų vyresniųjų grupėje apdovanotų autorų darbus. Jų pasirinktos temos ir vaizdinė raiška skirtinė: nuo lyriškų, nespalvotų armėno Alex Tarverdi ar ruso Konstantin Tsokur fotografijų iki ironiškai popkultūros spalvingą blizgesį pamėgdžiojančių Lauros Norinkevičiūtės fotografijų; nuo vizualių latvio Daniels Mekss ir rusės Diana Mikheeva šiandieninio gyvenimo metaforų iki Fedor Jakušin iš Rusijos reportažų, pasakojančių konkrečius benamių kasdienybės įvykius.

Konkurso prizininkų abiejuose amžiaus grupėse darbai atspindi tai, kas jaunosios kartos kūrybą daro įdomią ir skatina į ją nuolat atsigréžti kūrybinės fotografijos scenoje jau įsitvirtinusius šios srities profesionalus. Jautumas betariškai patiriamai tikrovei ir savo vidiniams išgyvenimams, atvirumas kūrybiniams eksperimentams, debiuto sukuriama intriga susiekia jauniesiems autoriams kūrybinio potencialo, kurio gali pakakti ne vieneriems metams. Kai šis potencialas susilieja su techniniu ir estetiniu meistriškumu bei nuosekliu darbu, gimsta ne vien jaunujių fotografų kūrybos kontekste reikšmingi kūriniai, nužymintys naujausias fotografijos tendencijas.

The photo competition "Young Man in The 21st Century" took place already for the seventh time in 2015. Seven years are a considerable period for the photo contest, especially if this contest is meant for young authors. Significant changes occur not only in photography, but also in other fields of contemporary art during seven years. New relevant creative tendencies reveal itself and the debutants who have establish these tendencies become acknowledge artists. One can expect similar discoveries in this contest as well, because the works by young authors are usually characterized by dynamic change, experiments and creative freedom, which is not constrained by traditions and institutions of art.

One of the most important preconditions for such discoveries is the immediate experience of the captured life along with real emotions and its undisguised revelation in creative work. Thus the most important criteria of evaluation of submitted works remain unchanged for many years – the reflection of relevant youth problems. The ability to sense what is important for the youngest generation and to convey it sincerely in photography can be a key to success not only in this contest, but also in the future creative career. For example, well known Lithuanian photographer Rimantas Vikšraitis surprised the international audience and won the prize of the discovery of the year in 2009, in Arles photo festival (France). Here Vikšraitis presented frank, artistically unpretentious, but socially revealing photographs of Lithuanian village people.

However such sensibility for present day (youth) life and openness to creative experiments is inherent only in few works of the participants of the contest. No matter how strange it may look, many young authors choose predictable topics or just reproduce the messages of mass media and public opinion. Smoking, alcohol, addiction to modern technologies – all of these problems are real in contemporary society of course. But how much these "statistical" maladies are important for the particular author of the photographs? Perhaps photographers and their friends, who stage these common problems in front of a camera, struggle to solve their personal, individual problems in real life? Even if these problems seem small and not worth publicity, it may be recognized by the contemporaries and noticed by professionals of photography?

It is not by coincidence, that the first prize in the group of younger authors was granted to Gabrielė Vekinaitė, who speaks about personal experience and relations through her works. Polish author Anna Soczawa and Katarzyna Mielech from Lithuania,

who won other prizes also choose "small" and personal stories, which relate past and present time, different generations and life circumstances. Ukrainians Vladimir Miščenko and Mariya Basova experience and capture what most of us see only in mass media – the political unrest and echoes of military conflict in their country. Meanwhile personally experienced reality and social environment is as important as unconstrained creative experiments in the works of Lithuanian photographer Ignė Grikevičiūtė.

The importance of technical and aesthetic quality reveals itself in the group of older photographers. Although in every case, depending on the genre or topic of the photographs, the criteria for the quality is different, but the authors noticed by the jury choose the stylistics of their works reasonably and follow the chosen style consistently. The stylistic integrity of the creative work and its high quality distinguished the winner of the Grand Prix from Russia Mikhail Shestakov. The author chooses different genres – nude, portrait – but it is not merely empty creative experiments. In each case his works are united by clear aesthetic solutions, which convey convincingly the idea or emotional content of the photograph. The same can be said about the works of other authors, who were granted prizes in the group of older photographers. They choose different topics and visual expression: from lyrical, black and white photographs by Armenian author Alex Tarverdi or by Russian photographer Konstantin Tsokur to the works by Lithuanian artist Laura Norinkvičiūtė, who appropriates ironically the colorful glamour of pop culture; from visual metaphors of modern life by Latvian author Daniels Meķess and Russian photographer Diana Mikheeva to the reportage about particular events in the everyday life of homeless people.

The works of the winners in both age groups reflect what makes the creative work of young generation interesting and motivate the established photography professionals to look at it again and again. Sensibility to the directly experienced reality and own inner feelings, openness to creative experiments, the intrigue created by the debut – all this gives to the young authors creative potential, which can be sufficient for many years. When this potential unites itself with technical and aesthetical excellence and consistent practice, the works significant not only in the context of young photographers are born, marking the newest tendencies in photography.

This series of portraits is a conjunction of such styles as romanticism and pictorialism. While studying history of photography I noted that many art experts consider pictorialism to be a dead-end in photography development and the attempt of XIX century's masters at conveying the techniques of painters and graphic artists in photography to be pointless. At the same time, photography appeared during the era of romanticism which strongly influenced the photographers of that time thus starting the genre of pictorialism. With help of modern digital technologies I tried to make a series of photos that meets these styles' laws (the object of photography representing the external and spiritual beauty, "an enjoyment of beauty expressed in tranquil contemplation") as well as modern demands (conceptuality, seriation, typology). I pictured girls of my age, 9-10th graders trying to show their beauty and create characters whose clothes and accessories couldn't be linked to an epoch or geographic location so that the viewer could imagine something familiar and closer to himself.
